

General Notice Safety and Ground Regulations Llanelian Road

Notice: Entry to the Ground is expressly subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations and the rules and regulations of The Football Association. The Ground Regulations incorporate Colwyn Bay Football Club's Safety Policy. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the Ground Regulations

Safety

Supporters are assured that Colwyn Bay Football Club is in communication with the police and local authority to ensure that crowd safety in the stadium and its surrounds on match days is not compromised so far as matters are within the Club's control.

Colwyn Bay Football Club and in particular those volunteers within the Club with specific responsibilities for safety, undertake to ensure, as far as is practicable, that all activities taking place within the stadium are conducted in a manner that places spectator safety above all other considerations.

The Club's primary responsibility, through its safety policies, will be to ensure the reasonable safety of all persons attending the stadium. The Club has appointed a Stadium Safety Officer who will be responsible for ensuring the implementation and maintenance of the ground regulations.

Ground Regulations

All matches are played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and appropriate body.

Play cannot be guaranteed to take place on any particular day or at any particular time and the Club reserves the right to change its advertised fixtures without prior notice and without liability.

In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Match, refunds (if any) will be made in accordance with the Club's Customer Charter. The Club will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited to) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.

Unauthorized persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.

With the exception of authorised Media representatives holding accreditation issued by the Club/event organiser, the taking of photographs or filming by any means within the Ground is prohibited. In addition, no transmission or reproduction, in whole or in part, in any form, or by any means, electronic, mechanical, recording or otherwise is permitted save with a special authorisation in writing by the Club/event organiser and, where appropriate, the prior consent of the Football Association or appropriate body.

Only persons specifically authorised in writing by the Club are permitted to offer Newspapers, Periodicals or any other Articles for sale in the Ground.

Unnecessary noise such as from the use of radio sets and behaviour likely to cause confusion, annoyance or nuisance of any kind, is not permitted in any part of the Ground.

Foul, abusive or racist language or conduct is totally forbidden.

Please note that it is an offence punishable by law for any person to enter or attempt to enter the Ground:

- Whilst in possession of a prohibited container which is or was capable of holding liquid and which if thrown would be capable of causing injury to another person
- Whilst in possession of alcohol [Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985]
- Whilst drunk [Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985]
- Whilst in possession of any article or substance whose main purpose is the emission of a flare for purposes of illuminating or signalling or the emission of smoke or a visible gas
- Whilst in possession of any article which is a firework and all persons entering the ground may be searched by the authorized stewards or the Police. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the ground

Standing is forbidden in seated viewing areas.

Banners, or other articles which could, or might be used as a weapon, or to cause annoyance or offence, are not permitted within the Ground.

Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any objects whether on to the pitch.

At all times, the right of admission is reserved by Club Management and in general no transfers within the Ground are allowed.

The Club reserves the right for its stewards and members of police force to remove from this Ground any person who does NOT COMPLY WITH GROUND REGULATIONS AND WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS of the Football Association, and/or, where applicable, the Regulations of the Football Association of Wales Competitions or whose presence in the Ground is or could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance, or annoyance to other Spectators.

The Club excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
